Holden at the CASTLE of YORK, in and for the COUNTY of YORK, on SATURDAY the 20th Day of July, in the Third Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, and in the Year of our Lord 1822, before the Right Honourable Sir CHARLES ABBOTT, Knight, Chief Justice of our said Lord the King, assigned to hold Pleas before the King himself, and the Honourable Sir GEORGE WOOD, Knight, one of the Barons of our said Lord the King, of his Court of Exchequer.

PRISONERS' NAMES.

- 1 (aged 60) JOSHUA HODGSON the elder, committed at the Lent Assizes, holden the 9th day of March, 1822, for wilful and corrupt perjury, as a witness in the prosecution—(the King against Robert Sellers.)
- 2 (aged 22) ROGER DOBSON, committed the 15th day of March, 1822, charged upon the oath of Edward Cass, of the township of Whithy, in the North-riding, mail-rider between Whithy and Pickering, with having, on Monday the 11th day of March, 1822, about fifteen miles from Whithy, feloniously robbed him the said Edward Cass of the mail-bags, which he was conveying from Whithy to Pickering.
- 3 (aged 25) THOMAS ROBINSON, late of Stainmoor, in the county of Westmoreland, miner, committed the 19th day of March, 1822, for that he, together with one Paul Armstrong, John Brown, Thomas Lowe, John Ewebank, John Dennison, and divers other persons to the number of twenty and more, on the 15th August, 1821, unlawfully and riotously did assemble together, in the parish of Grinton, in the North-riding, in a tumultuous manner, for unlawful purposes, with force and arms, and did then and there continue for a long space of time.—And further charged, on the oath of Thomas Alanson, of Keld, in the county of York, gamekeeper, with threatening to kill, wound, maim, or otherwise hurt and injure one Simon Peacock.
- 4 (aged 30) GEORGE MELLOR, } weavers, committed the 21st day of March, 1822, charged upon the oath of Richard Sykes, of Stainland, in the West-riding, innkeeper, and others, with having, on the morning of the 20th March, 1822, feloniously stolen and taken away from his dwelling-house, in Stainland aforesaid, nine shillings and sixpence in silver, one ham of bacon, one large piece of hung beef, five shirts, and three pair of stockings, the property of the said Richard Sykes.
- 5 (aged 32) RICHARD WALKER, and } pair of stockings, the property of the said Richard Sykes.
- 6 (aged 22) JAMES CROMPTON, }
- 7 (aged 25) ROBERT WELFORD, committed the 27th day of March, 1822, charged upon the oath of John Durham, of Masham, in the North-riding, with having, on the night of Friday the 15th day of March, 1822, feloniously and burglariously broken into the dwelling-house of Thomas Durham, of Masham aforesaid, and stolen therefrom a quantity of copper, handkerchiefs of several denominations, worsted merino stockings, british and foreign cambrics, and other articles, the goods and chattels of the said Thomas Durham, John Durham, and Robert Durham, of the value of three pounds.
- Also further charged upon the oath of John Alton, late constable of Masham, with being a deserter from the 16th regiment of horse or Queen's Lancers.
- 8 (aged 33) MARMADUKE DENNISON, of Knottingley, in the West-riding, committed the 28th day of March, 1822, charged upon the oaths of William Bew, of Burton Hall, Thomas Whitaker, of Glass Houghton, and Thomas Brough, of Castleford, in the said riding, with feloniously stealing three ewe sheep, the property of William Bew.
- 9 (aged 21) GEORGE CALVERT, committed the 28th day of March, 1822, charged with being strongly implicated in the above felony, and cannot find sureties for his appearance at the ensuing Assizes, to give evidence against the said Marmaduke Dennison, for the said felony.
- 10 (aged 17) ROBERT MOSELEY, and } committed the 9th day of April, 1822, charged upon oath, for that they the said Robert Moseley and Robert Ibbetson, in the night of the 7th day of March, 1822, at Bradford, in the West-riding, feloniously did enter the dwelling-house of one Edward Warburton, and therefrom did steal, take, and carry away twenty-three promissory notes, for the payment of one pound each, two coats, two waistcoats, one pair of breeches, one top coat, one shawl, one cloak, three silk spencers, eight yards of bombazeen, thirteen gowns and gown pieces, and divers other goods, the property of the said Edward Warburton.
- 11 (aged 22) ROBERT IBBETSON, ... }
- 12 (aged 60) JEREMIAH SMITH, late of Giggleswick, in the West-riding, committed the 12th day of April, 1822, charged upon oath, with having, on the 2d day of October, 1821, feloniously stolen, taken, and carried away a certain paper parcel, containing promissory notes to the amount of one hundred and fourteen pounds two shillings, the property of William Birkbeck, John Birkbeck, William Nicholson Alcock, Henry Alcock, John Peart, and John Moffatt.
- 13 (aged 36) ELIAS SMITH, committed the 12th day of April, 1822, charged upon oath, with being an accessory after the fact, in receiving a paper parcel containing certain promissory notes to the amount of one hundred and fourteen pounds two shillings, the property of William Birkbeck, John Birkbeck, William Nicholson Alcock, Henry Alcock, John Peart, and John Moffatt, knowing the same to be feloniously stolen.
- 14 (aged 29) JANE HARDY, late of the city of York, committed the 19th day of April, 1822, charged upon the oath of John Glover, with having purchased of him three steel saws and three files for the purpose of cutting iron, and also with having conveyed the same to her husband John Hardy, then a prisoner and convict in the said castle of York.
- 15 (aged 26) ROBERT CRAGGS, committed the 30th day of April, 1822, charged upon the oath of John Christian, of Gilling, in the North-riding, shop-keeper, with suspicion of burglary, by forcibly breaking into the dwelling-house of the said John Christian, and feloniously stealing and carrying away from thence one hat, and various goods and chattels, his property, to a very considerable amount, on Tuesday night, April 23d, or early on the following morning the 24th April, 1822.
- Also further detained upon the oath of Gabriel Mitchell, of Hackforth, in the North-riding, with suspicion of burglary, by forcibly breaking into the dwelling-house of the said Gabriel Mitchell, and John Mitchell, his father, at Hackforth aforesaid, and feloniously stealing thereout a knife, the property of the said Gabriel Mitchell, and a snuff box, the property of his father, and various other articles, on Saturday night the 20th April, or early on Sunday morning the 21st April, 1822.
- 16 (aged 25) ISAAC JESSOP, committed the 3d day of May, 1822, charged (with one Robert Gill, not in custody,) upon the oath of Jonathan Toothill, of Hopton, in the parish of Mirfield, in the West-riding, and others, with suspicion of having, on the night of the 29th of April, 1822, feloniously and burglariously broken open the dwelling-house of the said Jonathan Toothill, at Hopton aforesaid, and feloniously stolen therefrom six silver tea spoons, and one pair of silver tea tongs, the property of the said Jonathan Toothill.
- And further charged on the oath of Joshua Robinson, of Honley, in the parish of Almondbury, in the West-riding, dyer, and others, with suspicion of having, in the night of the 1st day of May, 1822, feloniously and burglariously broken open the dwelling-house of the said Joshua Robinson, at Honley aforesaid, and feloniously stolen therefrom seven silver tea spoons, and one pair of silver tea tongs, the property of the said Joshua Robinson.
- 17 (aged 19) ISAAC JOHNSON, of the township of Selby, in the West-riding, committed the 6th day of May, 1822, charged by the oath of Matthew Finch, of the said township, painter, on suspicion of having stolen and taken from out of a desk in the house of the said Matthew Finch, a quantity of provincial notes, several pieces of gold of different value, and some silver, the whole amounting to thirty or thirty-five pounds, a gold watch chain, two wedding rings, and one empty silver plated ring purse, the property of the said Matthew Finch.
- 18 (aged 29) WILLIAM BRADBURY, late of Scarborough, in the North-riding, labourer, committed the 4th day of June, 1822, charged upon the oath of Thomas Arthur, of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, chain cable manufacturer, on suspicion of having, on the 29th day of May, 1822, at the parish of Hunmanby, in the East-riding, feloniously stolen and carried away from the person of the said Thomas Arthur, privily and without his knowledge, a guinea note, of the banking house of Joseph Robinson Pease and George Liddell, Hull, made payable to Mr. John Newton, or bearer, and dated the 14th August, 1820, No. A 2509, signed "Joseph R. Pease," the said note being the property of the said Thomas Arthur.
- 19 (aged 17) HENRY THOMPSON, and } committed the 11th day of June, 1822, charged by the oath of Thomas Myhan, for that they the said Henry Thompson and William Brammer did, on the 4th day of June, 1822, at Sheffield, in the West-riding, feloniously steal and take away from the person of the said Thomas Myhan, on the King's highway, a purse containing twenty pounds and upwards.
- 20 (aged 20) WILLIAM BRAMMER, ... }
- 21 (aged 26) JOSEPH OWEN, committed the 18th day of June, 1822, charged upon oath, with having, on Saturday evening then last, at the parish of Swillington, in the West-riding, violently and feloniously made an assault on Elizabeth Dixon, of Nagsome Green, in the said riding, and feloniously ravished and carnally known her against her will.
- 22 (aged 45) JAMES HEWSON, late of Leeds, in the West-riding, labourer, committed the 21st day of June, 1822, charged upon the oaths of Francis Hotham, John Matthew, and William Watson, of Bishop Wilton, George Boys, and Thomas Hyde, of Barmston, and William Spence, of Emsall, all in the East-riding, with having, on the night of Thursday the 20th day of June, 1822, feloniously stolen a black gelding, from off the lands of the said Francis Hotham, in the township of Bishop Wilton aforesaid, the property of the said Francis Hotham.
- 23 (aged 30) JOHN SKAIFE, committed the 22d day of June, 1822, charged upon the oath of Sarah Brown, that he the said John Skaife did, on Tuesday the 18th day of June, 1822, by force, feloniously commit a rape upon her the said Sarah Brown.
- 24 (aged 54) JOHN HEMINGWAY, and } both of Gomersall, in the West-riding, butchers, committed the 24th day of June, 1822, charged upon the oath of Robert Nayler, of Heckmondwike, in the said riding, and others, on strong suspicion of having, on the night of the 22d, or early on the morning of the 23d days of June, 1822, feloniously stolen and taken away, from a field in the possession of Abraham Nayler, of Heckmondwike aforesaid, one male or tup sheep, the property of the said Abraham Nayler.
- 25 (aged 32) JOHN HEMINGWAY, junr. }
- 26 (aged 21) WILLIAM LUMB, and } both of the parish of Almondbury, in the West-riding, labourers, committed the 12th day of July, 1822, charged upon the oath of Betty Harrison, of Golcar, in the parish of Huddersfield, in the said riding, for that they the said William Lumb and Joseph Oldfield, on the 2d day of July, 1822, at Linthwaite, in the parish of Almondbury, violently and feloniously did make an assault upon, and her the said Betty Harrison, against her will, then and there feloniously did ravish and carnally know.
- 27 (aged 23) JOSEPH OLDFIELD, }
- 28 (aged 31) FRANCIS PONTJY, committed the 11th day of July, 1822, charged upon oath, that he the said Francis Pontjy, on the 7th day of July, 1822, at Leeds, in the borough of Leeds, feloniously did assault one Mary Ann Rawson, and against her will, then and there feloniously did ravish and carnally know.
- 29 (aged 14) HANNAH PIERSON, committed the 16th day of July, 1822, charged upon the oaths of Hannah Reynard and William Waller Howard, with having feloniously stolen divers and sundry articles of wearing apparel, the property of the said Hannah Reynard.
- 30 (aged 22) ROBERT MOORE, & } committed to the gaol of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, and removed by a writ of habeas-corpus to the castle of York, the 20th July, 1822, charged upon oath, with suspicion of feloniously and burglariously breaking and entering into certain barns and out-houses, belonging to and occupied with the dwelling-house of Richard Wilson, of Ferriby, in the county of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, and stealing thereout two quarters and two bushels of wheat, two bushels of oats, three quarters of tares, and fifteen hempen bags the property of the said Richard Wilson.
