# Summer Reading Challenge and Events

Welcome to this year's Summer Reading Challenge and activity programme "Animal Agents". This is happening in every Explore York Library.

We challenge all children aged 5 and over to read six books over the summer holidays. We will give you prizes for each book you read and when you have read 6 books you will get a medal and certificate. 100 children who complete the challenge will win the chance to come to a celebration event at Acomb Explore Library on Sunday 15th October, get the chance to win other prizes and take part in fun reading activities.

Look out for our Arts Award Discover activities marked with the Arts Award logo, and gain a national award over the summer by attending 3 events, learning about an artist and coming and telling about them all at our Big Share events. You can drop in to these on



Saturday 16th September at York Theatre Royal or at Explore York Library on Sunday 17th September, both from 1 – 3 pm.

And we are not leaving the under 5s out. Sign up and get a sticker card. You then collect a sticker for each book you read. When you have 6 stickers we will give you a certificate.

Best of all it is free to take part.

## Park to Park walking trail and children's activity map

Anytime, with a brochure from the café at either Rowntree Park or Homestead Park to Homestead Park or Rowntree Park. Free.

Did you know that two of our Reading Cafes have connections to the Rowntree family? Why not walk from Rowntree Park to Homestead Park (or vice versa!) and find out more about them? Our leaflet for adults gives a brief history of both parks and suggests a walk between the two. Our children's trail has a map of things for children to spot on the way. The walk takes approximately 1 ½ hours. The last section is not suitable for wheelchairs or large buggies, but an alternative route is suggested.



## York Then and Now: Using an 18th Century map, find and draw historic landmarks in the modern city

Anytime, collect a map from York Explore, York City Centre. 50p per map.

Come to York Explore and pick up a copy of one of our treasure from the archive, Peter Chassereau's map of York created in 1750. Take a tour of the city centre and see if you can locate and draw some of the historic landmarks sketched along the edges of the 18th Century map. Discover what buildings have survived the centuries, which are used for the same purposes today and which buildings have taken on a new lease of life in the 21st Century. Come back to York Explore and show staff your drawings, in exchange for a tasty treat!



## Arts Award Discover Summer 2017

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Arts Award Discover is an introductory award aimed at 5 to 9 year olds (although any child can take part.)

Explore York Libraries and Archives, York Minster, York Museums Trust, York Army Museum and York Theatre Royal are offering children the opportunity to gain Arts Award Discover through taking part in any three creative activities and finding out about artists and crafts people. Collect a stamp or sticker at each activity then come to the either York Theatre Royal on Saturday 16 September or York Explore Library Sunday 17th September between 1.00pm and 3.00 pm to complete

your award by telling us what you did. Remember you need to tell us what you have learnt about an artist too. After talking to you we will apply for an Arts Award certificate for you which will be posted to your home. Look out for the Arts award logo in this brochure for other sessions that you can also use towards your Arts Award Discover.

You can also attend these sessions if you do not want to take the Arts Award.

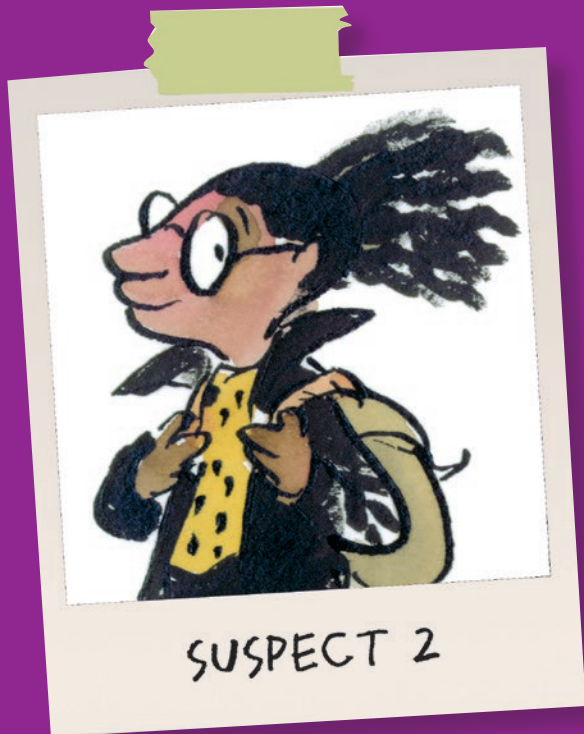


There are 500+ children's & young people's books on our e-library.
